MINUTES OF THE SEPT. 23rd GENERAL BUSINESS MEETING

President Duane Engle called the meeting to order at 7:32 p.m. there were 5 individuals from the Executive Board, 33 members and 3 visitors in attendance. Duane welcomed the RAil representatives to the meeting. A motion to accept the August 2014 minutes as printed was made by Larry Mundell and seconded by Don Crabtree. The motion passed.

RAil Presentation – Promo video and event information. Dale Woodland commented on how this event will benefit the RCT&HS: This event will build community connections and public exposure as many locals do not know about our museum here in Hamburg.

The September meeting of the Executive Board was held at 7PM on September 2nd at the Reading railroad Heritage Museum in Hamburg, PA. Major topics of discussion and motions carried are as follows:

- Financial The treasurer presented the monthly report. John Greene and John Brown presented their monthly report on fund raising planning.
- RAil Project Concerns about the RAil group and their planned project were discussed resulting in passing the following four part resolution: First, there will be no expenditures of funds in excess of the RAil fund balance. RAil needs to name the RCT&HS as an additional insured on their liability insurance policy. Third, RAil must provide a guarantee to cover any financial obligations incurred beyond the RAil fund balance. Fourth, RAil needs to provide a written plan expressing exactly how this event is to operate including anticipated budget and timeline and what resources are required of the RCT&HS. RAil will be given three weeks to meet these terms. President Duane Engle appointed John Brown, John Greene, Jim Adams, Karen Confer and Dale Woodland to meet with RAil to discuss the above resolution.
- **Museum** Bill Hodson presented a Munchkin Railway report.
- Membership Rate Changes The board passed a motion to present a recommendation to the general membership to increase to the individual, family, and contributing membership dues by \$5 for the 2015 membership year.
- MP&RE Paul Payne presented a monthly report to the board
- Miscellaneous "lunch room" project inspection report, Lansdale Historical Society artifact loan request, the new rack card was reviewed, and other miscellaneous items of which there is nothing to report.

Carol Adams held a question and answer session about the conceptual drawing and specifications of the rail car protection building. The purpose of this building is to provide cover for some of our collection as directed by the membership in a recent poll.

There were questions on the accuracy of the conceptual drawing produced by our architect, whether we should install HVAC, the safety of having a gravel floor vs. a concrete floor, and how often the building will be open to the public if at all.

As of now, the building is planned as a storage building and will not have heat or air conditioning. Plans are to have a gravel floor and to not use the building as museum display space. Planning committee members reminded everyone that the drawing we have is a conceptual drawing and does not necessarily represent what the final building will look like.

The committee goal is to plan a rail equipment protection building in an economical way and that the building will be built to code. Modifications can be made after the building is installed as money becomes available.

The Munchkin Railway Station construction is basically completed with the shingling of the roof. The front is painted but some painting remains to be completed on the sides and rear. We will be extending the rail siding into the station so that the operators will no longer have to carry the cars in and out and place them on the track.

More screened topsoil has been delivered and spread in anticipation of tall fescue sod being applied. Tall fescue tolerates full sun and partial shade and has deeper roots than other grasses. Thank you to Mike Stehman and Tom Schuker for your help.

A Reading diamond has been installed in front of the station and some flowers will be planted this fall, but most of the gardening will wait until spring.



RCT&HS Year 2015 Reading Railroad Calendar



The RCT&HS Year 2015 railroad calendar is now available. To celebrate its 30th Anniversary in 2012, the Norfolk Southern Railroad (NS) had twenty locomotives painted into the paint schemes of its predecessor railroads. Since rail lines of the former Reading Company play a key role in the NS system, one of its new EMD SD70Ace locomotives was painted into a Reading Railroad paint scheme. The RCT&HS was contacted by NS to obtain paint diagrams and paint chips to make sure that the new paint scheme was accurate. The new paint scheme followed the paint diagram used for the five EMD SD45 locomotives delivered to the reading in 1967 with a modification similar to the lines of Alco C630 #5308 in the frame area. The new locomotive was numbered 1067 on NS's roster. Interestingly, when the numerals are reversed the number becomes 7601 which was the number of one of the Reading's SD45's. The "Queen Bee", as the Reading unit has been nicknamed, has traveled over home rails at least seven times to date. The theme of this year's calendar is NS 1067 ON READING RAILROAD RAILS featuring 13 color photographs of the locomotive on the former Reading Company Main Line, Norristown, East Penn, and Lebanon Valley Branches.
